“Or maybe she grinds them into fine powder to make fairy dust.”



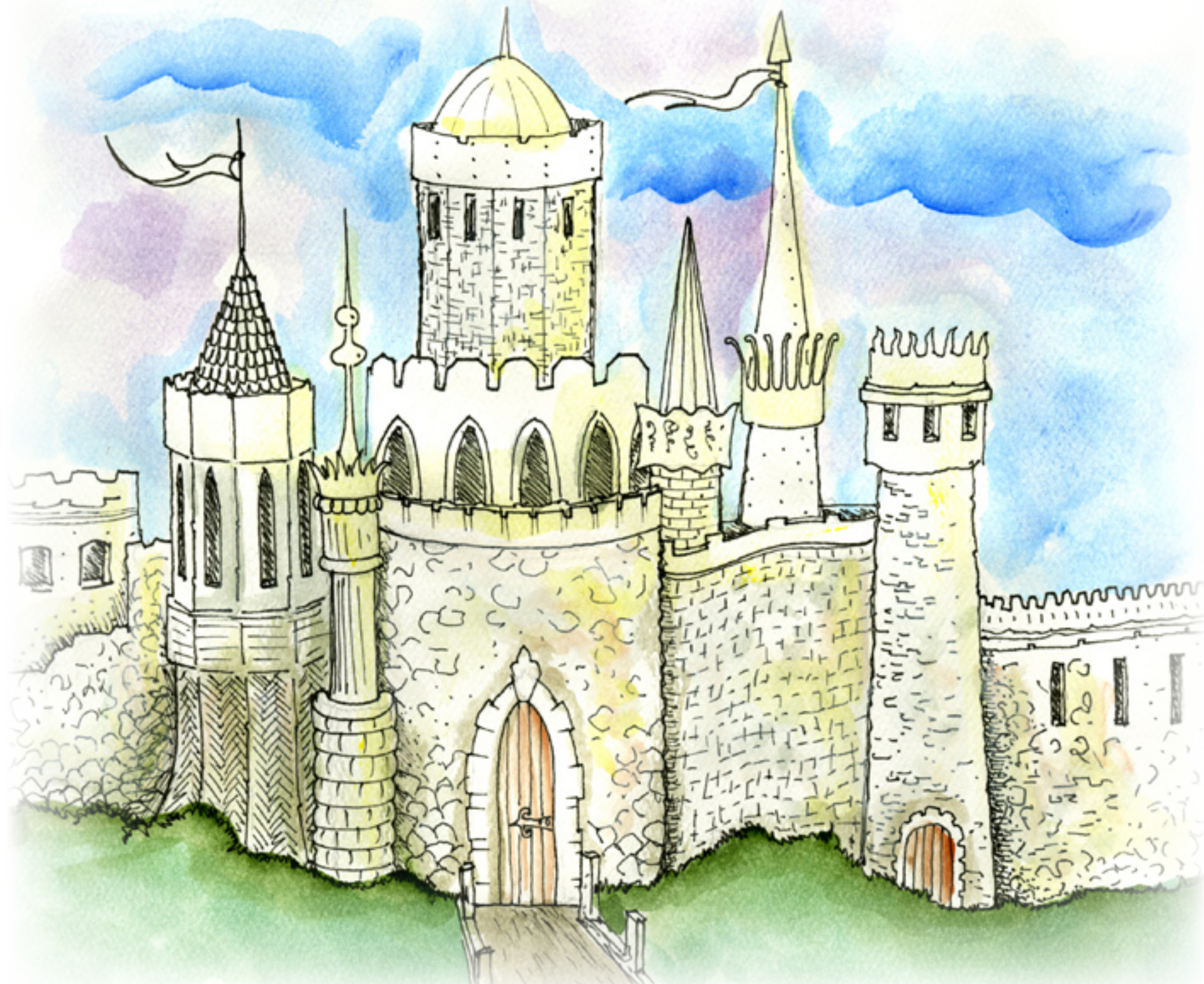


“Or what about throwing them in the ocean to make pearls?”

“Because she’s got magic sparkle fairy dust,” replied Mom.


“And how does she know when there’s a tooth under my pillow?”
